NEW ON-LINE PAYMENT SYSTEM FOR CASINO EMPLOYEES

Carson City, Nevada -- The Gaming Control Board's Employee Registration Unit launched a new on-line payment system for gaming employee registration applications on June 17, 2011. The on-line payment process is simple and user friendly, and only takes about 5 to 10 minutes to complete.

This final phase of the Board's on-line application initiative makes the process of gaming employee registration 100% paperless if the casino employee pays on-line, thereby eliminating the need for the casinos to mail in any paperwork and speeding up the registration process by about 5 business days on average. This results in quicker turnaround for applicants seeking secondary employment or renewing their gaming registrations, and allows the casinos to reconcile their records with the Board in a more timely fashion.

As of August 15, 2011, the Board had processed 2,572 credit card payments, which totaled 48% of all applications received since the system went live.

"This new system is just one in a series of technology projects in progress at the Board," said Chairman Mark A. Lipparelli, "The Board is working to digitize all of its revenue collection activities for the State of Nevada. These activities will both simplify the reporting and payment process for taxpayers and allow an expedited transfer of collections to the State General Fund."

The new system accepts Visa, MasterCard, American Express and Discover cards. Applicant profiles are created by the Human Resources departments at casinos at the time of hire, and applicants are given a user name and password to log into the Board's on-line application system. At the end of the on-line application, the system gives the applicant the option to pay on-line using a credit card or debit card. The option to pay via money order or cashier's check still exists, even if using the on-line registration system.

The Board utilizes First Data's PayPoint software to process on-line payments, the same system used by the Nevada Department of Motor Vehicles.
