INSTRUCTIONS TO APPLICANTS REQUESTING LICENSING TO CONDUCT PARI-MUTUEL WAGERING

AN APPLICANT FOR LICENSING TO CONDUCT PARI-MUTUEL WAGERING IS SEEKING THE GRANTING OF A PRIVILEGE, AND THE BURDEN OF PROVING THE APPLICANT'S QUALIFICATIONS TO RECEIVE SUCH A LICENSE IS AT ALL TIMES ON THE APPLICANT. AN APPLICANT MUST ACCEPT ANY RISK OF ADVERSE PUBLIC NOTICE, EMBARRASSMENT, CRITICISM, OR OTHER ACTION, OR FINANCIAL LOSS WHICH MAY RESULT FROM ACTION WITH RESPECT TO AN APPLICATION, AND EXPRESSLY WAIVES ANY CLAIM FOR DAMAGES AS A RESULT THEREOF.

Licenses required: A nonrestricted gaming license under the authority of chapter 463, and a pari-mutuel license under the authority of chapter 464 of the Nevada Revised Statutes, and any other applicable state license or permit shall first be required to conduct pari-mutuel wagering.

Off-track pari-mutuel wagering: Any pari-mutuel system of wagering approved by the Nevada Gaming Commission for the acceptance of wagers on (a) Races which take place outside of this state; or (b) Sporting events.

Pari-mutuel system of wagering: Any system whereby wagers with respect to the outcome of a race or sporting event are placed in a wagering pool conducted by a person licensed or otherwise permitted to do so under state law, and in which the participants are wagering with each other and not against that person. The term includes off-track pari-mutuel wagering.

FORMS AND REQUIREMENTS FOR FILING FOR LICENSURE TO CONDUCT PARI-MUTUEL WAGERING. All forms can be found on our website at gaming.nv.gov:

1. Form 13: Application to Conduct Pari-Mutuel Wagering.
2. A floor plan showing the location of the pari-mutuel betting area and its separation from other areas of gaming. (*Include Surveillance System*)
3. Name, date of birth, social security number, and brief resumé of designated key employee.
4. Internal Control System.
5. Organizational chart.
6. A sample of tickets.
7. Associated equipment reporting form and supporting computer systems documentation as required by NGC Regulation 14.
8. A check or money order in the amount of \$500 to cover the application fee. Checks are to be made payable to the Nevada Gaming Control Board.
9. The total cost of the investigation is to be borne by the applicant. This cost includes all transportation, food and lodging; plus an hourly charge for the time expended by the agent or agents assigned to the application. Before the investigation can begin the applicant must provide a deposit in an amount equal to the total estimated expenses, including the hourly charges.
