ULTIMATE GAMING APPROVED FOR INTERACTIVE GAMING

CARSON CITY, NV – The Nevada State Gaming Control Board (“Board”) has approved a field trial for Ultimate Gaming’s intrastate interactive gaming system. This is the first field trial authorized under NRS 463.750 and Assembly Bill 114, which was signed into law by Governor Sandoval on February 21, 2013. Ultimate Gaming becomes the first interactive gaming service provider in Nevada to go live with intrastate interactive gaming.

In 2011 the Nevada Legislature found that “To protect and promote the health, safety, morals, good order and general welfare of the inhabitants of this State, and to carry out the public policy declared in NRS 463.0129, it is necessary that the Board and Commission have the ability to license service providers by maintaining strict regulation and control of the operation of such service providers and all persons and locations associated therewith.”

“I am proud to be a Nevadan today, and to have witnessed the efforts of so many come to fruition. I wish to commend not only Governor Sandoval and the Nevada Legislature for their visions and ability to quickly pass new legislation, but I also want to cite the many employees of the State Gaming Control Board for their tireless and often unrecognized dedication. Their devotion over the last several years has made today a reality, and my appreciation goes out to them for their efforts,” Gaming Control Board Chairman A.G. Burnett stated earlier today.

“Governor Sandoval, the legislature, and gaming regulators have worked diligently to protect the public, as the first intrastate Internet poker system rolls out for a field trial in Nevada,” Nevada Gaming Commission Chairman Peter Bernhard said. “During and after all field trials, I encourage members of the public, gaming licensees and other interested parties to bring to the Gaming Control Board any questions, concerns, issues, and problems experienced in attempting to use Nevada’s licensed and approved intrastate systems. The Board and Commission will be gathering pertinent data and comments during field trials, to see whether our State’s concerns are being met as to system security, privacy protection, gaming integrity, location verification, prohibition of underage gaming, play by vulnerable persons, and assistance to law enforcement. Nevada is committed that gaming activities within its boundaries remain effectively regulated and in compliance with all federal, state and local laws and regulations. I believe that intrastate Internet poker can provide an enjoyable entertainment alternative for those in Nevada, provided we all work together to be sure that the systems meet all legal and regulatory requirements.
