**STIPULATED DISCOVERY PLAN  
AND SCHEDULING ORDER**

13 The State of Nevada, on relation of its NEVADA GAMING CONTROL BOARD  
14 (BOARD), Complainant herein, by and through its counsel, AARON D. FORD, Attorney  
15 General, and JOHN S. MICHELA, Senior Deputy Attorney General, and STATION  
16 CASINOS LLC and NP RED ROCK LLC, dba RED ROCK CASINO RESORT SPA  
17 (RESPONDENTS), by and through their counsel, MARC H. RUBINSTEIN hereby jointly  
18 submit this Stipulated Discovery Plan and Scheduling Order in compliance with Nevada  
19 Gaming Commission Regulation 7.070.

20 The parties stipulate and agree to the following:

- 21 1. Unless otherwise provided herein or by Order of the Commission Chair, any  
22 pleading, motion, request, paper, or document of any kind or nature which is filed with  
23 the Commission shall be filed by sending such pleading, motion, request, paper, or  
24 document by electronic mail to the Executive Secretary at [mbell@gcb.nv.gov](mailto:mbell@gcb.nv.gov) and shall be  
25 contemporaneously served upon the counsel for the opposing party and counsel for the  
26 Commission. Counsel for the BOARD may be served at [jmichela@ag.nv.gov](mailto:jmichela@ag.nv.gov). Counsel for  
27 RESPONDENTS may be served at [mrubinstein@rrblf.com](mailto:mrubinstein@rrblf.com). Counsel for the Commission  
28 may be served at [tbreinig@ag.nv.gov](mailto:tbreinig@ag.nv.gov).

1           2.     Except as may be agreed upon by the parties or ordered by the Commission  
2 Chair, all depositions may be taken only upon fifteen (15) days' notice to be computed as  
3 provided in Nevada Rule of Civil Procedure 6(a).

4           3.     The parties have previously complied with the requirements of NGC  
5 Regulation 7.080(1) and (2). The Board provided its mandatory exchanges pursuant to  
6 Nevada Gaming Commission Regulation 7.080(2) on or about October 27, 2021.  
7 Respondents shall make their mandatory exchanges pursuant to Nevada Gaming  
8 Commission Regulation 7.080(2) no later than January 28, 2022. All items produced by  
9 the BOARD shall be deemed confidential pursuant to Nevada Gaming Commission  
10 Regulation 7.090 and marked as "confidential." Confidential items shall not be delivered  
11 by electronic mail but may be personally served or served through the United States  
12 Postal Service. Any requests made by the RESPONDENTS pursuant to NGC Regulation  
13 7.080(3) and (4) shall be made on or before 5:00 p.m., January 31, 2022. The BOARD  
14 shall comply with the requirements of NGC Regulation 7.080(3) and (4) on or before 5:00  
15 p.m., February 15, 2022, if timely requests have been made RESPONDENTS.

16           4.     All motions, oppositions and replies allowed by NGC Regulation 7.200 shall  
17 be filed and served within the time frames provided therein, unless made during the  
18 Commission's hearing in this matter as permitted by NGC 7.200(1).

19           5.     Unless otherwise ordered by the Commission Chair, all discovery shall be  
20 completed by and no discovery may be had after 5:00 p.m., April 30, 2022.

21           6.     The parties shall file with the Commission, as required within paragraph 1  
22 above, on or before 5:00 p.m., May 31, 2022, the prehearing briefs. The briefs shall  
23 include:

- 24           a.     A statement of admitted facts;
- 25           b.     A statement of facts in support of that party's position;
- 26           c.     A list of witnesses that the party intends to call in support of its  
27 position; and
- 28           d.     A memorandum of legal points and authorities in support of that

1 party's position.

2 7. The parties shall meet, confer, and develop a list of exhibits, which will be  
3 offered into evidence by each party at the hearing of this matter before the Commission.  
4 All such proposed exhibits shall be pre-marked. On or before 5:00 p.m., May 20, 2022, the  
5 original list of proposed exhibits shall be filed with the Commission, together with eight  
6 (8) copies of the list and exhibits, and shall:

7 a. Sufficiently describe each exhibit for identification purposes;

8 b. Indicate which exhibits have been agreed upon by both parties to be  
9 admissible at the hearing without objection by the opposing party; and

10 c. Identify the exhibits to which objections have been made and clearly  
11 state the grounds upon which objection to the exhibit is made.

12 Counsel shall stipulate to the authenticity and admissibility of exhibits wherever  
13 possible.


14 IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the hearing on the merits of NGC Case No. 21-04
