January 2006 Nevada Gaming Revenues and Collections

Win Revenue Summary – November 2005

Nevada's nonrestricted gaming licensees reported a total "gaming win" of \$999,615,276 for the month of November 2005. This amounts to a 16.01% <u>increase</u> compared to November 2004, when licensees reported a gaming win of \$861,673,070. For the fiscal year (July 1, 2005 through November 30, 2005), gaming win has increased 13.28%.

Percentage Fee Collections for the Month of December 2005

The State collected \$63,294,947 in percentage fees during the month of December 2005, based upon the taxable revenues generated in November 2005. This represents a 15.88% (or \$8,672,070) increase compared to the prior year's December, when percentage fee collections were \$54,622,877.

Compared to the May 2005 Economic Forum's projections, percentage fee collections for the first six months of fiscal year 2006 are 6.20% (or \$22,406,032) above their forecast. Collections for the current month were 9.87% above their forecast.
