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## **Current conventions snapshot - NV**

- MJBizCon: Las Vegas Convention and Visitors Authority currently allows the annual convention at LV Convention Center
  - MJ convention focused on cultivators, producers, and dispensaries
  - ~18,000 attendees
- 2017 The Hemp and Cannabis Fair: LVCVA allowed at Cashman Center
- 2017 High **Times Cannabis Cup**: Hosted by Moapa Band of Paiutes
  - MJ industry trade show
  - ~15,000 attendees
  - The LINQ hosted box office and shuttle service for the event
- CannaGrow Expo: Reno ~500 cultivators taking classes; open to public
- Reno-Sparks Convention and Visitors Authority has interpreted their bond covenants to exclude marijuana conventions at the Reno-Sparks Convention Center and Livestock Events Center

- NCIA's Cannabis Business Summit & Expo (San Jose 2018) ~6,000 attendees

- CannaGrow Expo (Palm Springs 2018) ~500 cultivators

- Hawaii Cannabis Expo **Honolulu** ~2,000 attendees
- MJBizConNEXT New Orleans new convention focused on emerging technologies




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# **Opportunities for regulatory conferences**



#### Marijuana Legalization Status

- Medical marijuana broadly legalized
- Marijuana legalized for recreational use
- No broad laws legalizing marijuana
