**NOTICE OF WORKSHOPS REGARDING
STATEWIDE GAMING EMPLOYEE REGISTRATION**

Attention: Nonrestricted Licensees and Interested Parties

Pursuant to statutory provisions passed during the 20th Special Session of the Nevada Legislature, the Nevada Gaming Commission must adopt regulations (no later than December 31, 2003) to replace NGC Regulations 5.100 through 5.108. The existing regulations governing the statewide gaming work permit system will become obsolete when that system is replaced on January 1, 2004, with statewide gaming employee registration. The new regulations the Commission is charged with adopting must:

- Establish uniform procedures for the registration of gaming employees;
- Establish uniform criteria for objection by the Board to an application for registration; and
- Provide for the creation and maintenance of a system of records that contains information regarding the current place of employment of each person who is registered as a gaming employee and each person whose registration as a gaming employee has expired, was objected to by the Board, or was suspended or revoked.

Consequently, the Chairman of the State Gaming Control Board has directed staff to develop proposed regulations to comply with the new statutory provisions. Towards that end, regional workshops will be held for the purpose of discussing draft regulations. The workshops will be held as follows:

Those wishing to offer input regarding the draft regulations are encouraged to attend one of the workshops. Input from licensees and interested parties is being solicited for the benefit of the Gaming Control Board and Nevada Gaming Commission to facilitate the development of proposed regulations and procedures that will promote the "Public Policy of the State Concerning Gaming" (NRS 463.0129) and be accommodating of gaming employees.
