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TO: ALL NONRESTRICTED LICENSEES AND INTERESTED PARTIES

RE: NRS 463.0157 GAMING EMPLOYEE REGISTRATION – NEW REQUIREMENTS

Effective July 1, 2007, the definition of a gaming employee (NRS 463.0157) was amended to include those employees (a) who are involved in the manufacture, repair or distribution of various gaming systems and (b) who are involved in the process of registering gaming employees.

It is imperative each gaming licensee ensures all gaming employees are in full compliance.

NRS 463.0157 was amended by the 2007 Legislature to read as follows:

“Gaming employee” means any person connected directly with an operator of a slot route, the operator of a pari-mutuel system, the operator of an inter-casino linked system or a manufacturer, distributor or disseminator, or with the operation of a gaming establishment licensed to conduct any game, 16 or more slot machines, race book, sports pool or pari-mutuel wagering, including:

- (i) Employees whose duties are directly involved with the manufacture, repair or distribution of gaming devices, cashless wagering systems, mobile gaming systems, equipment associated with mobile gaming systems, interactive gaming systems or equipment associated with interactive gaming;**
- (l) Employees whose responsibilities include performing the duties relating to the process of registration of gaming employees that a licensee is required to perform pursuant to the provisions of this chapter and any regulations adopted pursuant thereto;**

As far as subsection (i) above, the language is self explanatory, but the Board remains available if there are any questions regarding the scope of subsection (i).

In regards to subsection (l) above, this includes human resources representatives and/or any other licensee representative responsible for accessing the Board's System of Records or registering gaming employees. Please be advised this does not mean every human resource employee must be registered; only those individuals involved in the processing of gaming employees. In addition, individuals involved in the processing of gaming registrations are now required to be at least 21 years old, pursuant to NRS 463.350.

These changes have been in effect for over a month, but Board records show that many employees with access to the Board's System of Records, or those individuals performing the duties detailed in subsection (i) above, have not yet registered as gaming employees. Please be advised that there was no grace period associated with this change and it was anticipated that all licensees would comply upon passage.

Therefore, please ensure that all employees covered by these provisions immediately comply with NRS 463.0157 and register as a gaming employee. Failure to do so could result in disciplinary action against the licensee.
