TO: ALL NONRESTRICTED LICENSEES AND INTERESTED PARTIES

RE: GAMING EMPLOYEE REGISTRATION

On January 1, 2004, the Nevada Gaming Control Board assumed the responsibility of registering all gaming employees as defined in NRS 463.0157. Prior to, and since the inception of the program, the Board offered numerous training programs to educate licensees on changes to NRS 463.335 and on their responsibilities under Gaming Regulations 5.100-5.107. In addition, the Board has posted training aids in the form of a powerpoint presentation on its website, www.gaming.nv.gov, under Gaming Links, Gaming Employee Registration.

Unfortunately, the Board continues to see violations of the above mentioned Statutes and Regulations. Most of the violations appear to be the result of inattention to the process and/or a failure to properly train new Human Resources personnel; many also involve the failure of the licensee to properly submit required monthly and quarterly reports.

The Board expects each licensee to be in complete compliance with these statutes and regulations, ensure that all personnel involved in the hiring process are properly trained and that all gaming employees are current with their registration. The Board's Enforcement Division will continue to monitor compliance with NRS 463.335 and applicable regulations to ensure compliance.

The Employee Registration Unit of the Enforcement Division continues to offer training in this area. The Board has partnered with the University of Nevada in providing this training several times a year. The instruction is offered at the University of Nevada, Las Vegas (UNLV) and the University of Nevada, Reno (UNR).
