DATE:October 25, 2016TO:ALL NONRESTRICTED LICENSEES AND INTERESTED PARTIESFROM:KARL BENNISON, CHIEF OF ENFORCEMENTSUBJECT:REGISTRATION OF PLAYERS' CLUB REPRESENTATIVE

The Nevada Gaming Control Board recently reviewed and reevaluated its policy regarding the requirement for employees who handle players' club information to register as gaming employees pursuant to NRS 463.0157.

The requirement remains for an employee to register as a gaming employee for the purpose of handling players' club information if the employee has access to change a PIN or password on an account or has the ability to add any type of points/play/rewards to an account.

On the other hand, an employee can create a new account, regenerate/reprint a card or change basic information on an account, such as address or phone number, without being registered as a gaming employee. However, if an employee performs any of the functions listed in the paragraph above, said employee is required to be 21 years of age and must register as a gaming employee.
