SUBJECT: Updated Health and Safety Policies for Reopening after Temporary Closure

This Industry Notice amends the "Health and Safety Policies for the Resumption of Gaming Operations: Nonrestricted Licensees," amends the "Health and Safety Policies for the Resumption of Gaming Operations: Restricted Licensees," and supersedes Industry Notices #2020-25, #2020-30, and #2020-43 for purposes of the policies for nonrestricted and restricted licensees.

To meet its obligation under section 35 of Governor Sisolak's [Declaration of Emergency Directive 021](#), the Board reissues the following:

Substantive updates to the Policies are as follows:

- All licensees: Pursuant to Governor Sisolak's [Emergency Directive 024](#), licensees shall ensure that all patrons and guests properly utilize face coverings, subject to guidelines in the Directive (page 4).
- All licensees: Please note that section 7(3) of Emergency Directive 024 only deems a face shield a sufficient face covering if the individual has a medical reason as to why he or she cannot wear a face mask or cloth face covering.
- Nonrestricted licensees: There is no longer an exception from the face covering requirement at table games that have barriers or partitions between the dealer and each player.

In conjunction with state and local health officials, the Board will continue to ensure that best practices are used in the mitigation of COVID-19, and its effect on the resumption of gaming operations, and will issue further notices as appropriate.
