

Live Casino Hold'em Rules of Play

Game Description

Live Casino Hold'em is a poker game that is played against a live Dealer. The Player's goal is to win with a higher-ranking hand against Dealer's hand. Live Casino Hold'em features a main bet and the optional AA and casino Razz side bets. The deck is replaced every game round with a pre-shuffled deck. A shuffle machine is at the table adjacent to the Dealer shuffling cards ready for the next game.

Rules of Play

If a game round is in progress when a Player enters the table, they need to wait for the next one, and then, place the bets. To place a bet, the Player must choose a chip and place it on the betting position. Players can place several chips on different betting positions simultaneously. First, the Ante bet and/or the Blind Call bet must be placed in order to participate. Next, you can place the optional side bet(s), AA Bonus and Casino Razz. The timer in the game window shows how much time Players have left to place bets. After the No More Bets signal, the game round begins. Both the Player and the Dealer are given Two cards, the Player's cards are dealt face up, and the Dealer's cards are dealt face down. Following this the Dealer will then deal the flop (First 3 community cards). The Player can now choose to Call to continue playing against the Dealer; or Fold and lose their Ante bet. If the Player does not call within the time given, their hand will automatically fold, and they lose their Ante bet regardless of the hand they have. If the Player folds, the game is over for them. If at least 1 Player called, the Dealer the deals the turn and river card, and then reveals their hidden cards. The Dealer's hand qualification is examined. Even if all the Players folded, the Dealer's cards are revealed. If the Dealer qualifies and Player's hand is better than the Dealer's hand, the Player wins, and their Ante and Call bets are returned to them, along with their winnings according to the payout table. If the Dealer's hand is better, the Player loses their bets. Winnings are paid for the winning bets at the end of each game round. The Limits panel shows the payout info for a regular win with different hand combinations.

Blind Call feature:

Playing blind, the blind call feature allows to place a X2 call bet before the cards are dealt and automatically take part in that hand. It is important to remember that the call blind position is double the Ante bet. If the Blind call bet is placed first, the Ante bet is automatically placed, and the extra chips will be placed accordingly.

Side bets:

AA:

This is an optional bet, and you must place an Ante bet in order to play. If the Players first 2 cards and the flop include a pair of Aces or better, this bet will pay out according to the AA payout table. Players must call to win on the AA side bet.

Casino Razz:

This is an optional side bet. In order to play, Players must place an Ante bet. The goal of the side bet is to get the lowest possible five-card Poker hand from the Player's two cards plus first three flop cards. Ace is the lowest card and Jack is the highest. All cards from A to J are eligible for the side bet. Players always lose if they have Q, K, any Pair, Two Pairs, Three/Four of a Kind or Full House.
