

Lightning Roulette Double Zero

Rules of Play

Lightning Roulette Double Zero is an extended version of traditional American roulette. The game consists of a wheel with 38 numbers: 18 red, 18 black, a single zero (0) and a double zero (00). The ball can land with equal probability in any of those numbered pockets.

Players participate in the game by placing chips on the betting areas of the roulette table. The ball is spun in the direction opposite to the wheel's direction and then eventually lands on a number. Wagers placed on the winning number, or any combinations that include the winning number, are paid according to the payable.

The difference between traditional roulette and the Lightning Roulette Double Zero game is the payout for the Straight Up bet. In traditional roulette the Straight Up bet payout is 35 to 1. In Lightning Roulette Double Zero, the Straight Up bet payout is determined by the configured payable, and is either 29 to 1 or 30 to 1. However, this game offers a "Lightning Round" bonus feature. As soon as bets are closed, the game moves into the "Lightning Round" bonus feature, where between 1 through 5 "lucky" numbers ("Lucky Bets") are randomly selected. With the 30 to 1 payable, 5 "Lucky Bets" will always be randomly selected. At that point, a multiplier (the "Lucky Pay-Out") is also randomly selected and applied to the "Lucky Bets". "Lucky Pay-Outs" can be any one of the following: 49:1, 99:1, 149:1, 199:1, 249:1, 299:1, 349:1, 399:1, or 499:1 for the 29 to 1 payable, and 50:1, 75:1, 100:1, 150:1, or 200:1 for the 30 to 1 payable. If the roulette ball lands on a Lucky Bets number, any Straight Up bets on that number get the Lucky Pay-Out for that Lucky Bet.
