GAME RULES AND PROCEDURES

Definitions

"Coloured Pair" means a pair comprised of-

- (a) 2 red cards of different suits; or
- (b) 2 black cards of different suits.

"Face value" of a card means-

- (a) the number of the card, namely 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, 9, or 10; or
- (b) The type of card, namely jack, queen king or ace.

"Mixed Pair" means a pair comprised of 1 red card and 1 black card.

"Pair" means 2 cards with the same face value.

"Perfect Pair" means a pair comprised of cards of the same suit.

1. A player may choose to place an additional wager (a **"Perfect Pairs wager"** if the boxes for wagers on the blackjack table layout provide for Perfect Pairs wagers.
2. A player may place a Perfect Pairs wager on any box on which the player has placed a blackjack wager.
3. The betting limits for Perfect Pairs wagers will be displayed on a sign at the table.
4. A Perfect Pairs wager must be placed before any cards in the round of play are dealt.
5. A Perfect Pairs wager wins if the first 2 cards dealt to the player are a pair.
6. A Perfect Pairs wager loses if the first 2 cards dealt to the player are not a pair.
7. Winning Perfect Pairs wagers must be paid as follows-
 - 7.1 for a Mixed Pair- 6 to 1
 - 7.2 for a Coloured Pair- 12 to 1
 - 7.3 for a Perfect Pair- 25 to 1

'How Perfect Pairs wagers are dealt with

8. After each player has been dealt the first 2 cards, the dealer must-
 - 8.1 take all losing Perfect Pairs wagers; and
 - 8.2 Make a payout to each player who has a pair.
9. The dealer then goes on to deal with each player in the usual way for blackjack.

Equipment

10. A sign or table layout sign indicating the payout odds for winning Perfect Pairs wagers.
11. A sign indicating the minimum and maximum wagers for Perfect Pairs.
12. A table cloth marked in a manner similar to that shown in Diagram 1 with:
 - 12.1 areas for blackjack wagers, and
 - 12.2 Areas for "Perfect Pairs" wagers.

Your modification of the standard game of blackjack will constitute a change to the regular process of blackjack in that players are allowed to make a side wager. This side wager is in addition to the regular blackjack bet and must be placed before the cards are dealt.

A player will win this side bet if the first two cards dealt to him is a pair. There are three different types of pairs. A "mixed pair" is comprised of one red suited card and one black suited card. A "colored pair" is comprised of two cards that are different suits, with both cards being either red suited cards or black suited cards. A "perfect pair" is comprised of an identical pair.

This bet is resolved immediately after the deal and pays as follows:

<u>Pair Type</u>	<u>Paytable</u> <u>A</u>	<u>Paytable</u> <u>B</u>	<u>Paytable</u> <u>C</u>	<u>Paytable</u> <u>D</u>
Mixed Pair	6 to 1	5 to 1	5 to 1	5 to 1
Colored Pair	12 to 1	10 to 1	12 to 1	15 to 1
Perfect Pair	25 to 1	30 to 1	30 to 1	25 to 1

The combined value of this pair, a pair by the dealer or Blackjack by the dealer has no effect on the payouts or outcome of this side bet. "Perfect Pairs" can be played with 4, 5, 6, or 8 decks of cards.
