FINDINGS OF FACT,
CONCLUSIONS OF LAW
AND ORDER

12 The above-captioned matter came before the Nevada Gaming Commission
13 (Commission) on February 22, 2018, for an evidentiary hearing pursuant to Nevada
14 Revised Statutes (NRS) 463.337 and 463.310(3). Respondent, JESUS SAUCEDO, being
15 duly noticed of the hearing, appeared on his own behalf. The NEVADA GAMING
16 CONTROL BOARD (BOARD) appeared by and through its counsel, Michael P. Somps,
17 Senior Deputy Attorney General.

18 Having carefully reviewed and considered the evidence, including the arguments of
19 the parties, the Commission by affirmative unanimous vote of the four (4) Commission
20 members present found that the BOARD met its burden of proving the allegations set
21 forth in the Complaint by a preponderance of evidence pursuant to Regulation 7.230(1).
22 Therefore, the Commission, believing it to be fully advised on the facts and issues before
23 it, makes the following findings pursuant to NRS 463.310(6) and 463.3145:

24 FINDINGS OF FACT

- 25 1. That the Commission has jurisdiction in this matter pursuant to NRS
26 463.310(3) and 463.337.
27 2. That Respondent, JESUS SAUCEDO, is registered with the BOARD as a
28 gaming employee and, as such, is subject to the provisions of the Nevada

1 Gaming Control Act and the Regulations of the Commission.

2 3. That on or about June 17, 2017, Respondent was a registered gaming
3 employee employed by and working as a poker dealer at Parball Newco,
4 LLC, dba Bally's Las Vegas (Bally's).

5 4. That Bally's is a Nevada licensed gaming establishment holding a
6 nonrestricted gaming license.

7 5. That on or about June 17, 2017, Respondent was observed by a Bally's
8 Surveillance Agent taking a \$5.00 chip from the casino rake and placing the
9 \$5.00 chip in Respondent's token box.

10 6. That the \$5.00 chip that Respondent took from the casino rake was the
11 property of Bally's.

12 7. That on or about June 17, 2017, Bally's Director of Security signed an Arrest
13 by Private Person form and a Misdemeanor Citation/Complaint was signed
14 by Respondent.

15 8. That further review of video surveillance by Bally's revealed two (2)
16 additional occasions on June 17, 2017, where Respondent took a \$5.00 chip
17 from the rake belonging to Bally's and Respondent placed the \$5.00 chip in
18 Respondent's token box.

19 9. That Respondent's actions on June 17, 2017, in taking the three (3) \$5.00
20 chips from the casino rake and placing them in Respondent's token box were
21 intentional.

22 **CONCLUSIONS OF LAW**

23 10. That pursuant to NRS 463.337(2):

24 2. The Commission may revoke the registration of
25 a gaming employee if the Commission finds, after a
26 hearing as provided in NRS 463.310 and 463.312 to
27 463.3145, inclusive, that the gaming employee . . . ,
28 subsequent to being registered as a gaming
employee:

.....

1 (d) Committed, attempted or conspired to
2 commit larceny or embezzlement against a gaming
3 licensee or upon the premises of a licensed gaming
4 establishment;

5 11. Respondent, a registered gaming employee, committed, attempted or
6 conspired to commit larceny or embezzlement against Bally's.

7 12. Should any of the foregoing Conclusions of Law be deemed Findings of Fact,
8 they shall be so construed.

9 **ORDER**

10 Based on the preceding and in accordance with NRS 463.337(2):

11 IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that Respondent's registration as a gaming employee is
12 revoked effective February 22, 2018.


