FINAL ORDER OF EXCLUSION

On September 6, 2018, the Nevada Gaming Control Board (Board) entered its Order nominating ANTHONY GRANT GRANITO as a candidate to the List of Excluded Persons pursuant to Nevada Revised Statutes (NRS) 463.151 through 463.155 and Nevada Gaming Commission Regulation 28. After being personally served the Notice of Candidacy and Order of Nomination to List of Excluded Persons on September 11, 2018, ANTHONY GRANT GRANITO failed to request a hearing before the Nevada Gaming Commission (Commission) pursuant to NRS 463.153(1). The Board filed a Bill of Particulars on October 22, 2018. This matter came before the Commission on November 15, 2018. JOHN S. MICHELA, Senior Deputy Attorney General, appeared on behalf of the Board.

Having reviewed and carefully considered the record together with all of the evidence presented, the Commission, believing it to be fully advised on the facts and issues before it, makes the following findings:

FINDINGS OF FACT

- 1. Pursuant to NRS 463.151(3)(a), ANTHONY GRANT GRANITO has been convicted of crimes that are felonies in this state. Specifically:
 - a) On or about April 18, 2016, ANTHONY GRANT GRANITO was convicted in Nevada of Theft in violation of NRS 205.0832 and 205.0835(4), a Category B Felony and was convicted of Cheating at Gambling in violation of NRS

465.015, 465.083, and 465.088, a Category B Felony. ANTHONY GRANT GRANITO was sentenced to 100 months in prison with a minimum parole eligibility of thirty-six (36) months for the Theft conviction and was sentenced to seventy-two (72) months in the Nevada Department of Corrections with a minimum parole eligibility of twenty-four (24) months for the Cheating at Gambling Conviction. The facts giving rise to these convictions occurred in a licensed gaming establishment.

- 2. Pursuant to NRS 463.151(3)(a), ANTHONY GRANT GRANITO has been convicted of a crime which is a violation of the gaming laws of Nevada. Specifically:
 - a) On or about April 18, 2016, ANTHONY GRANT GRANITO was convicted in Nevada of Cheating at Gambling in violation of NRS 465.015, 465.083, and 465.088, a Category B Felony. ANTHONY GRANT GRANITO was sentenced to seventy-two (72) months in the Nevada Department of Corrections with a minimum parole eligibility of twenty-four (24) months for the Cheating at Gambling Conviction. The facts giving rise to these convictions occurred in a licensed gaming establishment.
- 3. Pursuant to NRS 463.151(3)(a), ANTHONY GRANT GRANITO has been convicted of crimes involving moral turpitude. Specifically:
 - a) On or about April 18, 2016, ANTHONY GRANT GRANITO was convicted in Nevada of Theft in violation of NRS 205.0832 and 205.0835(4), a Category B Felony and was convicted of Cheating at Gambling in violation of NRS 465.015, 465.083, and 465.088, a Category B Felony. ANTHONY GRANT GRANITO was sentenced to 100 months in prison with a minimum parole eligibility of thirty-six (36) months for the Theft conviction and was sentenced to seventy-two (72) months in the Nevada Department of Corrections with a minimum parole eligibility of twenty-four (24) months for the Cheating at Gambling Conviction. The facts giving rise to these convictions occurred in a licensed gaming establishment.

- 4. Pursuant to NRS 463.151(3)(c), ANTHONY GRANT GRANITO is a person of notorious and unsavory reputation whose presence in a licensed gaming establishment would adversely affect public confidence that gaming is free from criminal and corruptive elements. Specifically:
 - a) ANTHONY GRANT GRANITO's felony criminal convictions as described above;
 - b) ANTHONY GRANT GRANITO's conviction of a crime for violating gaming laws as described above;
 - c) ANTHONY GRANT GRANITO's convictions of crimes involving moral turpitude as described above; and
 - d) ANTHONY GRANT GRANITO's association with two (2) individuals who are currently pending inclusion on the List of Excluded Persons: James Russell Cooper and Jeffrey Douglas Martin. James Russell Cooper and Jeffrey Douglas Martin were named as a co-defendants with ANTHONY GRANT GRANITO in a case involving Theft in violation of NRS 205.0832 and 2050835(4) and Cheating at Gambling in violation of NRS 465.015, 465.083, and 465.088.
- 5. In addition to the preceding, ANTHONY GRANT GRANITO continues to have contacts with the State of Nevada and poses a threat to the interests of the State of Nevada and to licensed gaming as demonstrated by the fact ANTHONY GRANT GRANITO is still under supervision by the Nevada Department of Public Safety, Division of Parole and Probation, for his conviction for violating the gaming laws of Nevada.
- 6. The race, color, creed, national origin, ancestry or sex of ANTHONY GRANT GRANITO is not and has not been considered for placing his name on the List of Excluded Persons.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

- 7. The Commission has jurisdiction in this matter pursuant to NRS 463.153(1).
- 8. The procedural requirements of the Nevada Gaming Control Act and Nevada Gaming Commission Regulation 28 have been satisfied.
- 9. The sole issue before the Commission is whether at least one of the criteria set forth in NRS 463.151(3) to place ANTHONY GRANT GRANITO on the List of Excluded Persons has been met.
- 10. The Nevada Legislature has provided that the Board may nominate and the Commission may so include a person on the List of Excluded Persons by reason of the fact that such person has a "[p]rior conviction of a crime which is a felony in this state or under the laws of the United States, a crime involving moral turpitude or a violation of the gaming laws of any state." NRS 463.151(3)(a).
- 11. The Nevada Legislature has provided that the Board may nominate and the Commission may so include a person on the List of Excluded Persons by reason of the fact that such person has a "[n]otorious or unsavory reputation which would adversely affect public confidence and trust that the gaming industry is free from criminal or corruptive elements. . . ." NRS 463.151(3)(c).
- 12. The Commission has also determined that a finding of any one of the criteria set forth in NRS 463.151(3) is sufficient to place the name of an individual on the List of Excluded Persons. See Nev. Gaming Comm'n Reg. 28.010(2).
- 13. Given the preceding findings of fact, the criteria of NRS 463.151(3)(a), that ANTHONY GRANT GRANITO has been convicted of a crime which is a felony under the laws of this state, is met. The criteria of NRS 463.151(3)(a), that ANTHONY GRANT GRANITO has been convicted of a crime which is a violation of the gaming laws of any state, is met. The criteria of NRS 463.151(3)(a), that ANTHONY GRANT GRANITO has been convicted of crimes involving moral turpitude, is met. The criteria of NRS 463.151(3)(a), that ANTHONY GRANT GRANITO is a person of notorious or unsavory reputation which would adversely affect public confidence and trust that the gaming
